He was a teacher for many years in the San Francisco Unified School District, including his last assignment at Woodrow High School. He was a longtime member and president on the Board of the San Francisco Bay Area Educators' Credit Union for several years before his untimely death.


All entrants are expected to submit:

- ✓ An official transcript.
- ✓ A written essay on plain paper which answers the following questions:
 - 1. What volunteer and/or paid jobs have you held? How long? Please give specifics regarding service to others, whether volunteer or paid.
 - 2. Have you, as an individual or a member of a group, helped or defended those who have been treated unjustly? If so, please give examples.
 - 3. Do you have any special interest in one or more of the following:
 - Music, science, and/or computers? If so, please elaborate.
 - 4. What honors have you received?
 - 5. What is your occupational goal at this time?
 - 6. How do you intend to serve others in your own chosen field?
 - 7. What further education will you need?

The Selection Process:

- 1. All 12th graders in the San Francisco Unified School District are eligible to submit an entry.
- 2. Essays must <u>not contain</u> the entrant's name, the name of his/her high school including school clubs, team names, or any other identifying information as to the writer or school's name. Such identification will <u>disqualify the entrant!</u> The entrant's name and return address must appear <u>only</u> in the upper left-hand corner of the envelope shown below.

Entries must be received by 5:00pm on Friday, April 27, 2018 in an envelope addressed as follows:



3. Essays will be coded by the Richard Darrington Scholarship Committee to assure anonymity and fairness.

Criteria for final selection by the Scholarship Committee: Essay = 60 points / Transcript = 40 points

4. Winners will be announced by the end of May 11, 2018.
