

STUDENTS NEED RESOURCES, NOT RECALLS.

Our schools are facing crisis after crisis: budget deficits, vacant educator positions, an increasing need for social-emotional student supports and dilapidated buildings—to name just a few. The upcoming recall election will only make all these problems worse:

- It's antidemocratic, not grass roots—funded by venture capitalists who spent \$1 million to collect the 50,000 signatures needed to put recalls on the ballot and promote their agenda, not public education voices.
- It will replace elected school board members with board members appointed by Mayor London Breed, with no say for parents or voters in who she picks.
- It's a distraction from what really matters: giving our kids the resources and support they need to learn and thrive. This distraction only encourages further wasteful recall efforts that disregard existing election cycles.
- It's costing voters and taxpayers \$6 to \$8 million to hold this election. That's money that could go to our kids' education and our communities.

Recalls are the wrong priority when our students need so much right now. Agree? Then send a message: **Vote No on the school board recalls.**
